Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

From the Parochial Administrator's Keyboard:

Ecclesiastes is one of my favorite books of the Bible. This Sunday will be the only Sunday for the next three years where we read from Ecclesiastes. Yet for as rarely as we read from it this ancient book has a really contemporary message. The lyrics from the Byrd's song Turn, Turn, Turn come from Ecclesiastes 3. But that is not the relevance I mean. Ecclesiastes is the spiritual testament of the aged and wise King Solomon. God granted Solomon wisdom as a young man; he saw behind all of nature's mysteries. Solomon had tasted every carnal delight, and had immense power. Yet as so many find today, having chased all the world has to offer, Solomon, or as he calls himself in the book Qoheleth, that is the preacher, sees that none of it satisfies. "Vanity of vanities, all things are vanity!" This cry of all things are vanity, all things are ultimately empty resonates with many today. Many feel stuck, helpless, purposeless. Some, particularly young people, my generation, have raised apathy to a virtue. They lose themselves in a world of pleasures carnal and/or digital and say they just don't care. Well they say it in a way that would not be nice for a family bulletin article. Others on both the left and right feel frustrated with the "system" want to just burn it down. Solomon understood these impulses. What is the point of wealth if you can't take it with you? Is there anything new under the sun? Yes, there is a time to laugh and live, but there also is a time to cry and die.

In the end, having tasted every pleasure, wielded great power, seen behind nature's veil, and been disillusioned with it all Solomon says, "[This is the] end of the matter; all has been heard: Fear God and keep his commandments, for this is the whole duty of man." (Ecc.12:13) The answer is God and the path he lays out for us. Any other path leads to emptiness despite its initial promises. Why spend your money for what fails to satisfy?
